BONDSMEN LIABLE FOR ACTS OF AN OFFICER

Supreme Court So Holds in Case Where Sheriff Under Color of His Position Assaults Farmer and Causes His Arrest—Supreme Court Decisions.

In an action which is highly interesting because of its essential circumstances, as well as the principles of law involved, the supreme court has decided that the bondsmen of an executive officer of the law are liable as well as the officer himself for personal injuries inflicted upon an individual by the officer in an attempt to perform his official duties.
