FOLLOWS PARENT INTO THE GRAVE

Girl's Grief Heart Breaking as Remains of Mother Are Lowered From Sight.

Rendered hysterical through grief over the loss of her mother, and unable to bear the thought that the remains should be laid away in the earth, a girl created a pathetic scene yesterday morning at Calvary cemetery by attempting to throw herself into the open grave. Her condition was such that she had to be carried to the last rites had just been concluded when the girl, with heart-rending cries, dashed to the brink and was about to leap when a bystander caught her and gently but firmly led her away.

The scene at the grave was touching in the extreme. A family of seven children, the youngest but five years old, deprived of their mother, were gathered tearfully about among a number of friends.

Minnie, one of the eldest girls, who felt her loss most keenly, had been hysterical ever since her mother's death, last Thursday morning. At times she became so much affected that her mind was endangered. A physician was called and she was calmed. Thinking that she had recovered from her hysteria, those in charge of the funeral thought that it would be safe to allow her to attend the services at the cemetery.

On the way out she broke down and all efforts to quiet her were of no avail. At the grave, while the solemn rites were being performed, she wept pitifully, and at their conclusion, on an impulse, suddenly ran forward, crying:

"Oh, mamma! Oh, mamma!" She had made a spring and would have fallen in an instant had she not been caught. She was led aside and placed in a hack, in which she was hurriedly taken home. A physician was summoned and he did all in his power to quiet her. Her condition yesterday gave her friends cause for alarm.

The funeral was that of Mrs. Christine Lange, wife of Oliver Lange, and was held from the residence, 602 Robert street, Rev. A. J. D. Haupt, pastor of the Memorial Lutheran church, conducted the services.
