

FATHER OF NELSON BROTHERS MAY LOSE HIS MIND

Charles and Henry Convicted of Murder in First Degree and, With Sutton, Will Be Sentenced Wednesday for Murder of Krier.

Special to The Globe. OWATONNA, Minn., June 20.—A verdict finding Charles and Henry Nelson guilty of murder in the first degree was returned this morning, after nine hours spent in deliberation.

Shortly after 5 o'clock this morning Deputy Sheriff William Leaky, who had the jury in his keeping, was informed a verdict had been agreed upon.

The verdict was then handed to Judge Buckingham, who passed it to the clerk of court, who read the verdict aloud.

"We, the jury empaneled and sworn to try the guilt or innocence of the defendants Charles Nelson and Henry Nelson, find the said defendants guilty as charged in the indictment."

The conviction of Charles and Henry Nelson recalls the tragedy on the afternoon of Monday, April 13, when these boys, with William Sutton, waylaid and killed Harry Krier, a saloon keeper, a short distance northwest of Owatonna.
