CITY MAY NOT ADVERTISE.

Superior is enjoined from going into a Chicago scheme.

SUPERIOR, Wis., Aug. 2.—The county is enjoined from going into an advertising scheme to the extent of \$1,000. At the last meeting of the county board it was voted that \$1,000 be paid to the Chicago Live Coal Weathering Company of Chicago for the county edition of that paper, together with a certain amount of advertising. The injunction was obtained on behalf of the citizens' committee by Attorney T. L. Mitchell, who claims that the state law gives the county board no authority to spend anything on advertising. The board will probably repeal its act at the next meeting.
