

DAMAGE TO CROPS

Northern Pacific's Weekly Report Shows No Great Injury to Grain.

The Northern Pacific's weekly crop report, issued yesterday, shows that there will be a fair grain yield in the Northwest, in view of the inclement weather of the past ten days.

The greatest damage to the crops was done in North Dakota Saturday where there was a heavy wind storm accompanied by snow. In a few localities it is feared that the rain and snow will cause the wheat in shocks to ten sprout if warm weather follows the storm.

According to the estimates of the Northern Pacific's agents, the yield per acre will be as follows: In Minnesota, wheat, ten to fifteen bushels; oats, twenty to thirty-five bushels; barley, thirty to forty bushels; flax, eight to twelve bushels; potatoes, forty to seventy-five bushels; in Dakota, wheat, wheat, eight to twenty-five bushels, oats twenty to forty bushels; barley, seventeen to thirty-five bushels; flax, five to twenty bushels. The average percent of all the grain has been threshed.

The Report in Detail. Minnesota Division, Main Line East and South of Staples—Rains and cool weather during the past week have had a damaging effect on the corn, flax, hay and potato crops.

Wheat, ten to fifteen bushels; oats, twenty to thirty-five bushels; barley, thirty to forty bushels; flax, eight to twelve bushels; potatoes, forty to seventy-five bushels; in Dakota, wheat, wheat, eight to twenty-five bushels, oats twenty to forty bushels; barley, seventeen to thirty-five bushels; flax, five to twenty bushels.

St. Paul-Duluth Division—The recent heavy rains and cool weather are reported to have done some damage to the potato crop. Farmers fear that late potatoes are rotting in the ground. It is now considered that there will be only a half crop.

Fergus Falls and Black Hills Branch—Slight damage is reported to the crops as a result of the wet and cool weather of the past week. Threshing is practically at a standstill. The following average yields per acre are reported: Wheat, twelve to twenty bushels; oats, thirty-five bushels; barley, forty bushels; flax, thirteen bushels to the acre.

Red River Valley Branch—Threshing has been delayed about ten days by the rains. It is estimated that 60 to 75 per cent of all grains are threshed except wheat. Average yields per acre are as follows: Wheat, thirteen to eighteen bushels; oats, thirty to forty bushels; barley, thirty to forty bushels; flax, ten to fifteen bushels.

Fargo and Southwestern Branch—Continued wet weather has been unfavorable for the crops. Farmers fear that if dry weather does not set in soon that the grain will grow to a grade. Threshing is at a standstill. The following average yields per acre are reported: Wheat, twelve to twenty bushels; oats, thirty to forty bushels; barley, forty bushels; flax, ten to fifteen bushels.

Mandan to Dickinson—Rains the past week have delayed threshing. A severe wind storm on Friday and Saturday, however, has been a relief. What grains have been threshed averaged per acre as follows: Wheat, twelve to twenty bushels; oats, thirty to forty bushels; barley, thirty to forty bushels; flax, ten to fifteen bushels.

St. Paul passenger officials say that the present \$8 rate between the Twin Cities and Chicago will be canceled Oct. 5, when the old \$11.50 fare will be restored.

No change will be made before this date, as all the lines have advertised an \$8 rate to Chicago and return on account of the centennial celebration to be held in that city.

From a fairly reliable source it was learned yesterday that the Rock Island has agreed to act in union with the other lines, when the \$8 rate is withdrawn.
