

STEEL SYNDICATE IS EXTENDED

J. P. Morgan & Co. Get \$500,000 for Their Little Cheese.

NEW YORK, Oct. 1.—The syndicate organized to convert \$200,000,000 of United States Steel 7 per cent preferred stock into 5 per cent sinking fund bonds expired today, according to the original terms, but by consent of a great majority of its members, has been extended till July 1, 1904.

OFFICIAL PUBLICATION.

Of Ordinance Passed by the Common Council of the City of St. Paul.

Ordinance No. 2401.—An ordinance to authorize and provide for the issuance and sale of \$100,000.00 of the bonds of the City of St. Paul, Minnesota, to defray the expense of constructing public school buildings.

Whereas, the City of St. Paul, Minnesota, did duly include and provide in its budget for the year 1903, the following amounts for the respective purposes hereinafter stated, during the year 1903:

SECTION 1. That the proper City officers of the City of St. Paul, Minnesota, be and they are hereby authorized and directed to execute and issue, bonds of said City of St. Paul, in the following amounts and for the following purposes:

(1) One Hundred Thousand (\$100,000) Dollars, par value, in and of the bonds of said City for the purpose of defraying the cost of construction of public school buildings in said City.

SECTION 2. That said bonds when so issued shall be negotiated and sold by the Sinking Fund Committee, provided for in the charter of said City, and the proceeds thereof, including any premiums thereon, shall be credited to and placed in the appropriate fund or funds of said City.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, approval and publication in the official gazette of said City, and shall be subject to the action of the Board of Aldermen July 7, 1903.
