

FOLK WOULD AMEND EXTRADITION TREATIES

County Attorney of St. Louis and the President Plan Return of Boodlers.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Oct. 8.—Joseph Folk, the city attorney of St. Louis, who has been active in recent months in the prosecution of legislators and municipal wrongdoers in Missouri, was a guest of the president at luncheon today. Mr. Folk has encountered some difficulty in the performance of his duties on account of the escape of a few of those whose indictment he had secured into Canada and Mexico. He is anxious that the extradition treaties between those governments and the United States be so amended as to strengthen as to admit of the return to this country of the persons who have been indicted for robbery, embezzlement, etc.

After luncheon at the White house the president and Mr. Folk had a further conference at the executive office at which Secretary Hay was present. Together the three went over the matter of amending the extradition treaties carefully. Subsequently Mr. Folk had a brief conference with attorney General Knox at the department of justice along the same lines.

MILWAUKEE POLICE RAID TWO OF THE LARGEST JOINTS.

MILWAUKEE, Wis., Oct. 8.—A crusade against gambling houses in Milwaukee was started tonight, when the police raided two of the largest places in the city. Nearly forty frequenters of these places were arrested and taken to the police station. The paraphernalia found in each house was considerable and the raid is the result of considerable agitation of late on the part of several citizens and the boast by the gamblers that they were paying for protection.
