HEAVY RAINS RAISE THE OLD MISSISSIPPI

Water is at an Unusually High Stage for This Time of Year.

On account of the recent heavy rains the water in the Mississippi river is at an unusually high stage for this season of the year. The gauge yesterday read 12.5 feet above the low water mark. During the past few days the rise has averaged about six inches a day. Though the present stage is about two feet below the danger line, no damage will be caused, as the high water caused by the rain will recede as soon as the upper valley has been drained. The river may rise a little more during the next day or two.
