BOARD OF TRADE

For Real Estate and Business Properties, Chamber of Exchange Established.

A Bureau of information has recently been established in Minneapolis for the purpose of bringing the buyers and sellers of the Northwest to a common market. The Bureau is designed to supply detailed information covering all real estate for sale, rent or exchange, openings or locations for all lines of business and professions; and investments of all kinds, from lands to school and municipal bonds.

of the towns of the Northwest. These men have all lived in their respective communities for years, and are well acquainted and alive to the wants of their townpeople. They keep the Bureau informed of all persons who are in the market for the purchase or sale of lands, real estate, business, investments and professional openings or locations. The Bureau communicates with the owners of property for sale or exchange and with prospective purchasers, securing complete descriptions of properties for sale or exchange, and a thorough understanding of the intending purchaser's wants. A satisfactory transfer is thus secured with the least expenditure of time and money. The Bureau wants correspondents in every town, city and village, already represented, and allows reasonable fees for services. Persons desiring to act as correspondents should send their names stating the length of time they have lived in the town, city or village. The cost under the new system is the lowest possible. The property owner must send a complete and detailed description of the property to be sold, rent or exchanged, with a registry fee of one dollar. The description is then classified, printed and sent to the hundreds of persons who have sent in requests for descriptions of this particular kind of property. The owner must also agree to pay an advertising fee of fifteen dollars when the property is sold to a person he learns of through the Bureau. The intending purchaser must give the Bureau a thorough understanding of the property he wishes to purchase and the amount of money he has to invest, with a registry fee of one dollar. He then receives detailed descriptions of all the properties such as he wants for sale or rent in the Northwest, and when he advises the Bureau which one seems best to meet his requirements he is furnished with the owner's name and address. The intending purchaser must also agree to pay an additional fee of fifteen dollars when he closes a transaction, information being given to the Bureau by the owner.

A NEW SYSTEM.
All this is eliminated under the new system—a system so far-reaching that all the real estate and business openings in the Northwest are brought within a focus so small that the owner may sit at his own fireside and examine the whole field. And not only does the prospective real estate purchaser get the benefit of this vast economy of time and travel, but when he has selected a property that he desires to investigate with a view to purchasing, he is placed in communication with the owner, and if he buys it is at the owner's price.
