CATTLE RUSTLERS ARE AGGRESSIVE

South Dakota Cattlemen Are Greatly Angered by Costly Depredations.

Special to The Globe. SIOUX FALLS, S. D., Nov. 13.—The cattlemen in the western part of Fall River county, west of the Pine Ridge Indian reservation, have been greatly angered by the depredations of cattle "rustlers," who have recently become very bold in that section.

Preliminary to waging a systematic warfare on the rustlers, the cattlemen will publicly call attention to the state law, which provides a heavy penalty for the failure of persons selling beef to exhibit the hides of the animals.

WHAT LIVING COSTS FIGHT ON LAND LAWS

Census Bureau Answers Questions as to Workingmen. Irrigationists Are Suspicious of Hansbrough's Bill.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Nov. 13.—The bureau of labor has issued a bulletin on the cost of living of workingmen's families, showing that of 2,617 families in 33 states from whom data was obtained the average income per family was \$27.19.

The last figure is seven-tenths above the average of private families in the whole country, as shown by the census of 1900.

An investigation covering the years 1890 and 1902 shows that the cost of food reached its highest in 1902, the average then being 10.9 per cent above the average for the decade 1890-1899.
