

**FASHIONS FROM VOGUE**

Many remarkably smart looking gowns are made this year of rough and plain cloths combined in effective ways. It is generally imagined that such gowns will have a patchy appearance, but this is far from being the case if the costumes are cleverly made.

For example, the gown illustrated is undeniably smart in every way and has certainly much more character being made of the two cloths than if only one had been used. It is made of a rough novelty zibeline of mahogany brown combined with French broadcloth of the same color. The upper portion of the skirt, which is made of the zibeline, is circular in cut and opens in front a little to the left, where it is edged with a band of the plain cloth, and the lower portion is formed by a shaped flounce of the plain cloth cut in squares at the top and fitted to corresponding squares on the upper part. A medium wide braid of brown with a little green running through it is used to outline the squares, and large brown buttons embroidered with green silk are sewed on the plain brown squares.
