TIM HURST MUST SEE MORE MONEY

Grillo's List of Umpires Is Not Announced at Association's Meeting.

CHICAGO, Jan. 25.—The magnates of George Tebeau's Class A league met with President Grillo here today and adopted the changes in the constitution suggested by Tebeau, his attorney, Barker, and W. H. Watkins. It was reported that President Grillo would announce his staff of umpires at this meeting, but the announcement was postponed.

The changes in the constitution include the amendment substituting a plenary majority vote for the former two-thirds vote necessary to carry motions in the board of directors, and the reduction of the gate-receipts percentage. In former years the clubs paid 10 per cent of the gross net receipts into the league treasury, but this season but 3 per cent will be demanded. If the general fund under this new ruling proves insufficient an assessment will be made to make up any deficit. The general fund will be separate from the operative expense of the association. It will be used chiefly to liquidate the indebtedness caused by the recent war with the Western League.

President Grillo's failure to announce his umpires is due to the fact that at the last moment Tim Hurst informed the Tebeau league leader that he was out of the game at the time being. His friends say that he has announced his intention of going immediately to Madison and entering Wisconsin. Oech is a member of the freshman engineering class and comes from Winona.

Twenty of thirty candidates for places on the track team have been at work in the university army for a week or more in preliminary practice, and this week with the examinations will be begun with regular training will be begun with probably a much larger squad. The work so far has been very light, but as soon as the weather permits the men will take runs outside.

The most prominent candidates for the team are Capt. Haroldson, Colburn, Green and Murphy in the mile and half-mile; Tebbitt, Crossette, Robertson and Kinard in the quarter, and Yarrow, Rodman and Hunter, the Minneapolis Central sprinter, in the 100 and 220 yards. In the two-mile run there is no prominent candidates as yet, but Ivor Williams, the crack cross-country runner of the Minneapolis Y. M. C. A., is likely to try this spring. In the hurdles Hasbrook and Ostvig will probably do most of the work, although Henry O'Brien may be able to come out in the spring and Mike Beckman has some thoughts of returning. In the high jump Hasbrook, Twidit and Palmerton are the favorites. Among the pole vaulters are the Minneapolis Y. M. C. A. members, Burdick, Pattee and Dan Smith. With all these men the team seems likely to be a strong one, balanced and well equipped. The team will meet with Wisconsin in the spring, probably on the new track at Northrop field, either Iowa or Nebraska will also compete with Minnesota, and the team will be sent to the conference meet.

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind., Jan. 25.—The Indianaapolis football team has made a ten-strike in the engagement of a coach for its team of 1904. Manager Oliphant has received the acceptance of Curt G. Redden, a former star of the great Michigan end. Redden is regarded as the star of the United States in this position, having been selected to the All-American team. Not a critic in the West failed to place him in the All-Western team.

BAN JOHNSON ROASTS PITTSBURG MAGNATE

CLEVELAND, Ohio, Jan. 25.—Ban Johnson, of the American league, will have no further business dealings with Barney Dreyfuss, president of the Pittsburgh club and chairman of the schedule committee of the National league. Johnson made this declaration at a conference with Charles W. Somers, vice president of the American league, and some newspaper men here.

"I will never have anything to do with Dreyfuss," Johnson said. "I am a baseball man and believes himself in a class by himself. Before he can talk baseball to me again he will be in the best of shape, and he is likely to be blown away. Before there is anything more done on the schedule question between the American and National league the latter will have to send others besides Dreyfuss or we will never come to an agreement. I don't want to allow the National league to open the season in New York? Did we not give in to them last year, allow them to open the opening dates and the Decoration day holiday? Now, it is only fair that we get the opening dates and the Decoration day holiday. We will stand by the dates we have scheduled for New York, and if the National league wants to avoid conflicting they must allow them to us.

"Of course the National league would like to have the opening dates as before, but it is only fair that we get them. Still, I will not talk business until I have seen the other members of the National league schedule committee. Dreyfuss tried to boss me, but hereafter he will have to do as the other members of the league.
