He Takes a Respite From Toil at the Printer's Case After Forty-seven Years.

"Old Blodge" has laid aside the "stick." After nearly half a century passed before the printer's case, A. C. Blodgett, of St. Paul, has gone "out to the farm to rest up and dig worms for the spring fishing."

Mr. Blodgett was born in Lafayette county, Wis., April 21, 1844. He obligingly accompanied his parents to Howard county, Iowa, in November, 1856, following the year at the college of thirteen, he took his first vows of devotion to the craft upon the stone of the New Oregon Plaineader, now the Cresco (Iowa) Plaineader. This auxiliary lever for jolting the universe had just been established, in March, 1857, by George W. Peck, future governor of Wisconsin.
