MINISTER BOWEN RUNS AFOUL OF CASTRO

Resents Charge That He Had Pocketed Venezuela's Money.

WASHINGTON, D. C., March 31.—Secretary Hay has received a note from Herbert W. Bowen, the American minister at Caracas, recounting a recent experience he has had with President Castro. A Caracas newspaper published an apparently official form the charge that Mr. Bowen had pocketed several hundred thousand dollars of Venezuela's money. Mr. Bowen promptly sent a personal note to protest to President Castro, calling on him to take action against the paper. President Castro pleaded that he was unable to interfere with the paper, whereupon Mr. Bowen replied that he interfered whenever he chose to. While Mr. Bowen refused to dignify the matter by an official protest, his action in bringing it so vigorously to the attention of President Castro is heartily approved by the officials here.
