MR. McCUMBER AIRS PENSION MATTER

Congress Makes Haste to Clear Up Slate for Adjournment

WASHINGTON, D. C., April 21.--The pension appropriation bill carrying an appropriation of over \$137,000,000, and the emergency river and harbor appropriation bill, which carries \$3,000,000, were passed today by the senate, leaving only the general deficiency and the military academy bills of the entire list of supply measures still to be considered by the senate.

Democrats Stand Out.

With a demand that the Republicans say whether the minority party is to have an opportunity to press to a conclusion the question of adjournment, the Democrats held the senate in executive session for more than an hour today. The long session provoked the majority to call a meeting of their steering committee for tomorrow to decide on a definite adjournment programme.
