RUSSIA WILL NOT LISTEN TO MEDIATION

Neither Will She Allow Another Berlin Congress Affair, It Is Promised. ST. PETERSBURG, April 26.-It may be announced authoritatively that the talk of mediation in the Russo-Japanese war was founded upon the personal desires of King Edward and King Christian of Denmark to avoid further bloodshed and to bring about a truce. The emperor, with the full concurrence of the imperial family and his advisers, has decidedly and not only to reject all proposals looking to intervention, but to prosecute the war until victory crowns the Russian arms. The interference of outside powers will not be tolerated. There is to be no repetition of the Berlin congress.

It is also stated authoritatively that Russia will in no wise consider herself bound by the propositions made to Japan prior to the war. The hostilities have wiped out the engagements Russia offered to make with Japan regarding Korea and Manchuria. Russia will consider herself free to impose such terms as she desires and is able. Whatever has occurred in the direction of ending the war has been a level of cabinets and chambers above the level of the personal solicitations of the czar's uncle and grandfather. It is known that after the disaster to the Petropavlovsk, the Russian minister to the Japanese government wrote the czar a letter of sympathy, in which he expressed the hope that a peace could be found to avoid further bloodshed.

Ten days ago a dispatch from Tokyo stated that Japan, on the full occupation of Korea, might be willing to stop the war on the basis of this concession. This dispatch attracted little attention here at the time, but possibly may have had some connection with the movement of the Japanese to listen to mediation. They are in a bad temper on account of the losses and humiliations they have received, and if the czar were inclined to listen to the propositions and end the war at this moment he would do so against the almost unanimous protests of his subjects.

Plays a Strong Card.

ST. PETERSBURG, April 26.-Gen. Kuropatkin has played a strong card in the game of strategy. A large portion of Gen. Rennenkampf's Cossack cavalry division has been thrown across the upper reaches of the Tumen and a considerable force of cavalry which crossed the Tumen some time ago is moving down to the southwest to effect a junction with it. Together with this force, which totals 2,000 men, he will threaten Lieut. Gen. Inoye's left flank when the Japanese are ready to cross lower down on the Yalu. Being composed of cavalry, with a few mountain guns, Rennenkampf's force is extremely mobile. Unless it should be dislodged it will compel the Japanese to leave a very strong army to guard the communication, whereas if a Japanese force should be sent to drive it out it would have to move directly away from
