That said Board shall proceed without delay to assess the amount, as nearly as they can ascertain the same, which will be required to pay the costs and necessary expenses of such improvement, as provided by law; it being the opinion of the Council that the real estate to be benefited by said improvement can be assessed for such improvement to the extent of the damages, costs and expenses necessary to be incurred thereby.
