PIMMAS DOING WELL

Government Finds Mission Complaint is Unfounded

WASHINGTON, D. C., Aug. 5.—A thorough investigation by the interior department of the complaint recently made to the president by a delegation from the Presbyterian board of home missions that the Flat Indians of California are on the verge of starvation, reveals the fact that the Indians, on the contrary, are amply provided for. It was found that \$27,000 already had been authorized for the relief of the Pimmas during the fiscal year.

BLOOMINGTON, Ill., Aug. 5.—At a meeting of the local street car men's union this afternoon it was decided to call off the strike on the lines of the Bloomington & Normal Electric Railway and Power company, which has been in progress since Jan. 1. The strikers lost the fight, which was for an advance in wages, recognition of the union and easier runs for the older men in the service.
