## SHOW OF CATTLE

### BEST WIN IN THE WORLD

Celebrated Breeder Says Display of Shorthorns Excels Anything Anywhere

Hundreds crowded the big show tent at the fair grounds yesterday afternoon to see the display of Shorthorn cattle. Eleven entries were made, each entry consisting of an aged bull, aged cow, two-year-old heifer, yearling heifer and calf, under one-year-old. Minnesota, Wisconsin, Ohio, Missouri, Kentucky and Illinois Shorthorn breeders competed and Shorthorn enthusiasts declared that the showing this year at the fair is the best that was ever made in the United States. N. P. Clarke, of St. Cloud, who is one of the largest breeders of Shorthorns and Clydesdale horses in the country, and who makes annual visits to Scotland to replenish his stock, went the enthusiasts one better.

"I do not confine the competition to the United States," Mr. Clarke said. "The Shorthorn show, both in quality and numbers shown this year at the fair, is the best that the world has ever seen. I am been at the Royal and the Highland in Scotland several times and I am willing to say without fear of contradiction that the exhibit of Shorthorns at Hamline this year is greater than any I have ever seen in thirty years in the business."

### Crowd Sees Judging

The judging was witnessed by an immense throng. First prize \$100, was taken by the herd of the Tebo Land and Cattle Company, Clinton, Minn. This herd also won the \$200 silver tea service donated by the Merchants hotel St. Paul. Headed by the herd was Choice Goods, an imported bull, which has never been defeated in competition, and winner of the Chicago International sweepstakes. The animal sold as a three-year-old for \$7,500. Roberta, a grand cow, also of this herd, is valued at \$7,000. E. W. Bowen, Delphi, Ind., took second money; F. W. Harding, Waukesha, Wis., was third; and W. H. Dunwoode, Minneapolis, fourth, and D. R. Hanna, Ravenna, Ohio, fifth.

Fifty-eight Herefords were sold at public auction at the fair yesterday under the direction of the American Hereford Breeders' association. This herd, owned by Han and Col. J. A. Woods, of Omaha, conducted the sale, and the bidding was only fairly spirited. May Heslod, a fine cow, raised by W. W. Wheeler, of Iowa, brought the top notch price when she was knocked down to William Gardner, of Minneapolis, for \$275. Columbus E. A. prize was sold to C. C. Callahan, N. Cosgrove, president of the state fair association, for \$230, while \$110 was the general average of the sale. B. F. Martin, Clear Lake, Frank Rosenthal, Gracoville, and Thomas A. Nelson, Minneapolis, were among the heaviest buyers.
