What Revision Costs

The books of the state auditor show that of the appropriation of \$85,000 for the revision of the statutes, a total of \$67,768.90 has been expended.

Deny Attempting New Law

That the code commission has attempted to enact a distance tariff law is denied by the members of the commission.

Food Inspection

Chapter 21 of the revision relating to food inspection provides for a certificate to the secretary of state to the incorporation, and it specifies the facts to be certified.

Salaries of County Officers

County auditors and county treasurers have been given the right to compensation involving a number of changes in the compensation which these officers receive under existing law.

STATE MANDATORY ON FOREIGN COMPANIES

For the purpose of defraying the expenses of examination, the law makes the distinction as to whether examinations have actually been made or a certificate of a commissioner of another state has been accepted in lieu of the examination.

STOCK OR OTHER CAUSES

The requirement of an election by ballot is also new. There is no provision for filing vacancies in the books or holding over in case of failure to elect, such as is contained in Gen. Stat. 1894.

Section 24 relating to officers, is almost wholly new, but embodies the provisions applicable to manufacturing, etc., companies only. The provision that stock shall not be voted on within thirty days after its transfer on the books is new.

Section 25 providing for cumulative voting is new. The last two sentences of section 26, relating to transfer of stock, embodying the issue of a certificate of stock to a stockholder, are new.

Section 27, relating to the power of stockholders to elect directors, is almost wholly new. The existing law leaves such matters to be regulated by the by-laws. The provision making a proxy valid for only one year applies at present to railroad companies only.
