"Blessed are the Pure in Heart."

The beauties of Christianity have been most impressively exemplified by the stainless life and the triumphant death of William McKinley. It was not merely because of his magnificent service to his country as its chief executive that the whole country was plunged into such a depth of mourning when the announcement was heralded throughout the land that he had crossed the threshold into the world beyond. The people realized the loss of more than their President. They felt more keenly the loss of a man—one possessing the homely virtues of true manhood so dear to the hearts of the American people.

At one time in the life of our Master messengers came to Him from John the Baptist, asking him if he really was the Christ. Mark his answer: "Go and show John again those things which ye do hear and see: The blind receive their sight, and the lame walk, the lepers are cleansed, and the deaf hear, the dead are raised up, and the poor have the gospel preached to them." What a testimony as to his Messiahship was those fruits of His work. What a testimony to his Christianity were the last scenes of the late President's life.

Let us recall some of the words uttered by Mr. McKinley: "May God forgive him," immediately after the assassin had accomplished his bloody deed. Then his thoughts turned to his frail wife which caused him to say "I trust that Mrs. McKinley will not be informed of this. At least try to see that what she must know of it be not exaggerated in the telling." Then the first meeting of the husband and wife, after the shooting. "This is not our first battle, be brave, and I will make the battle of my life for your sake." And the last sad parting when he bade us ad good by, saying "It is God's way; His will be done, not ours,"—grandest of all sermons.

William McKinley has received great honors as a President, but he has received greater honors as a man. All can not be president but every young man can possess true manhood, a greater achievement.

In an address delivered in Cin.

ago Sunday Senator Dolliver emphasized the dead President's purity of heart as follows:

"A long acquaintance with the late President, in the intimacy of a personal friendship which ended only with his life, has always saved me from the error of judgement which has in some quarters underrated his abilities and underestimated the value of his public services; but, standing here, before yet the flowers have withered which cut their beauty upon his grave, I declare my belief that no achievement of his great career, no triumph of his epoch-making record at the United States capital will weigh so much for the welfare of the world as the everlasting ministries of the stainless life which he lived in the faith of the mother who taught him first to repeat the words of the Master, "Thy will be done."

The same thought was the keynote of an address given by ex-President Cleveland to a body of students of Princeton University, when he urged the young men to lay less stress upon mere mental attainment and to seek to cultivate those homely virtues which gave McKinley such power over his countrymen and at the same time made him universally loved. Speaking on this phase of the late President's career he said:

The man who is universally mourned today achieved the highest distinction which his country can confer on any man; and he lived a useful life. He was not deficient in education, but with all you will hear of his grand career and his services to his country and his fellow citizens you will not hear that the high plane he reached or what he accomplished was due entirely to his education. You will instead constantly hear as accounting for his great success that he was obedient and affectionate as a son, patriotic and faithful as a soldier, honest and upright as a citizen, tender and devoted as a husband, and truthful, generous, unselfish, moral and clean in every relation of life.

He never thought of any of these things too weak for his manliness. Make no mistake. Here was a most distinguished man—a useful man—who became distinguished, great and useful because he had retained unimpaired the qualities of heart which I fear university students sometimes feel like keeping in the background or abandoning.
