The Brotherhood of Calamity.

A great calamity seems to be the one thing needful to bring out the essential brotherhood of man. Nations may be indifferent or hostile to one and other in seasons of prosperity. But let a public disaster occur and the barriers of race prejudice break down. Before the urgent fact of suffering the common humanity of the world asserts itself.

Within less than a week after the overwhelming of St. Pierre the United States has appropriated several hundred thousand dollars for relief work and has dispatched vessels of its navy to succor the stricken people. They had no direct claim on America. They were subjects of a European power. Their home was a thousand miles from the Florida coast. Its very existence was hardly known here. But the news that the islands had been overwhelmed was sufficient to bring the resources of a stranger nation to her help.

The same manifestation accompanies every great disaster. When the hurricane swept away Galveston subscriptions for the suffering inhabitants were opened at once on the Liverpool cotton exchange. Kansas sent its wheat to starving India. Kansas City and its tributary territory poured out of its abundance to destitute Martinique. Ship loads of provisions went from this country to Ireland in the year of the famine. London sent \$50,000 to the villagers of Peru and Ecuador, whose homes had been destroyed in the earthquake of 1868.

In times of calamity men do not stop to consider whether those in distress are of their own creed or race. Ordinary commercial considerations and cold logic are

thrown to the winds. The only thing remembered is that fellow human beings are in extreme need. Suffering is the one fact with a universal appeal.
