May he not ask for time to breathe a little, to think a little, to live a little? May he not begin to remember that in the Pantheon there are other gods besides the great idol of Hustle? While doing his daily work and treading his common round has he not a right to some measure of this tranquillity which now he can look for only in the tomb?--in flinging a change of raiment into a valise and sailing out into that big, unsatisfactory void which we call Abroad? The human frame is not intended to endure the strain which the present conditions have placed upon it, and as the result the average hustler reaches the age of fifty almost a physical wreck. Hustling is a good thing, but too much of results disastrously.

Every able bodied man under fifty years owes it to himself and his country to be employed in some useful pursuit a part of the time, but no man can expect to get the best out of life without regular seasons of rest and a relaxation of the tired nerves. If we had the arranging of affairs we would set apart eight hours of the twenty-four for the pursuit of a chosen vocation, eight hours for sleep, and the remaining eight hours in some form of recreation.

Platt is a non-resident of the State of Missouri, and cannot be served with the ordinary process of law. 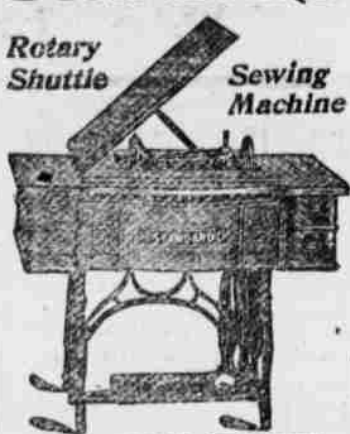
