### TEMPERANCE COLUMN

#### As To Paul's Advice.

(Written by an honorary member.) Once upon a time I attended a Sunday school when the lesson was on temperance. The worthy man who was superintendent read a lesson that chapter containing Paul's exhortation to Timothy to "use a little wine for thy stomach's sake."

In examining this sentence two questions present themselves: What inference can we draw from this exhortation? and of what value is it in our time?

Timothy was without doubt a total abstainer for there would be no sense in advising him to use a little wine if he were not a total abstainer. He was to use it as a medicine, and, when well, to discontinue its use.

And yet thousands of good people pervert this exhortation and use a little wine, and sometimes a great deal, not because they need it for their stomach's sake but to justify their practices.

Again, it should be remembered that medical science really had no existence in Paul's time. Hardly a remedy prescribed in that day would now be recommended by a physician. Even if wine has any medicinal value, which is not here denied, yet every physician knows there are many better remedies known to us, of which Paul was ignorant.

Timothy had a specific trouble. Paul prescribed a specific remedy, which we hope cured him. If Paul lived in the light of present medical knowledge, it is safe to say he would never recommend to Timothy what he did for Paul was a progressive man. And yet some men living in the twentieth century can see only what Paul saw in the first century.

How much like "Patent medicine" is wine. Patent medicine will cure all the ills that flesh is heir to. So will wine. What folly!
