The following from the Lamar Leader will be of interest to our readers who live in the Eason vicinity as the Barnesley boys are former citizens of that locality. W. S. Barnesley was formerly the Eason merchant and is the originator of the telephone system in this vicinity including the Jasper telephone system.

A deal was completed last week where by the Barnesley brothers became sole owners of the Monett Cutlery factory at Monett, Mo., where they expect to manufacture a complete line of first class, up-to-date cutlery. Two of the brothers are now in the markets in the east buying a complete stock of material and supplies and some extra work men for certain kinds of work.

"This will be the only complete Cutlery factory west of the Mississippi river and will certainly have a great advantage over other factories most of which are a thousand miles or more away, in the matter of freight.

Although the Barnesley brothers, U. S. R. T., T. C., F. F., E. O., and K. \$24,000,000 FOR ROADS.

A National Appropriation Of \$8,000,000 A Year, But The States Must Contribute A Like Amount.

There is pending in Congress a bill called the Brownlow Bill, introduced by Hon. Walter P. Brownlow, of Tennessee which appropriates \$24,000,000 as national aid for the building of wagon roads. This sum is to be available at the rate of \$8,000,000 a year; it is to be divided according to the population of the different States, but no State receiving National aid must appropriate and spend a like amount.

The asserted growth of sentiment in favor of the measure has been chiefly due to the institution and extension of the rural free mail delivery system which has brought the disadvantages of poor roads home to the farmers and other country dwellers. Applications for the extension of the free rural delivery system are being refused by the Post Office authorities on account of the roads, and the disappointed communities demand their improvement. These demands are so in excess of the ability of the local boards to resist that for a year past Highway Commissions all over the country have been putting them on record in favor of National aid.

It is claimed on behalf of the bill that the plan of distribution is more equitable than the distribution of a new \$32,500,000 a year under the Rivers and Harbors Bill, which goes principally to the seaboard States and to the Mississippi delta.

In support of the Brownlow Bill as a general measure, attention is called to the fact that France has 23,633 miles of wagon road, which are built and maintained by the nation, and Italy about 5,000 miles, while many of the States of the Union spend hundreds of thousands of dollars annually in aid of highway improvement.

A Good Corn Crop.

C. C. Riley, one of the prominent farmers of Northfork, was in town, Friday. Mr. Riley is one of the farmers in this county, who despite adverse conditions raised a good corn crop last year. His yield was thirty bushels to the acre, of good sound corn. Mr. Riley says he has farmed his present farm 26 years, and never failed to raise considerable corn, during any season that has yet passed—Lamar Democrat.
