It also accuses Jasper of "handing out a treatment" to one of her citizens who happened down this way. ### Behave on the Fourth.

Jasper will celebrate the anniversary of the nation's birth next Tuesday, and that means that there will be a big crowd of people here intent on having a good time. And Jasper wants everybody to have a good time, but the inclination for young America is to overdo the thing, with the result of a long list of fatalities, heartaches, headaches and the like to be chronicled among the day's experiences. The younger generation is supposed to enjoy a little more freedom on that day than on others, but the following admonition from the Christian Advocate might well be heeded by those who are inclined to carry their celebrating beyond the bounds of reason:

"The Nation expects to postpone for the time being the laws of order when the glorious Fourth of July comes round. It is a gala day. And behind the street parades, the fire-crackers, the lemonade and the 'exercises of the day' is a gladness and a pride as to the Nation which is sincere and profound.

"But there is an excess of noises and dangers which should not be tolerated. This excess is not fun; it is terror and it is malicious. The children are not the culprits. They are content with the smaller explosives and fireworks. But rough, hoodlums both rich and poor, cannot satisfy themselves with innocent fun; they must fire off revolvers and big torpedoes and bombs close to passers-by. There is nothing patriotic in this. It is rowdyism. It breeds bad blood in the tough who is guilty of the so-called practical joke.

"God has not dealt with any people as with our people. We have a history showing His handiwork. We believe we have a future that will show it more than ever.

"The Nation has its perils. These perils will put its perpetuity to the test. But why we are confident as regards the future is because of what in the past the American people in emergencies have shown themselves capable of doing. That past, what that past was, what made it, what principles were established by it, these are the thoughts which the Fourth of July should bring to the people of this Nation.

"Let the rowdy, rich or poor, behave himself on the Fourth. Let the happiness of the day be unspoiled by danger, demoniac racket and brutality. Let the joy of the children be tempered with thoughts of what the Nation is and what, in the tasks of this new age, the Nation should be."

## Influence of Women's Clubs on the Home

THE person who affirms that the women's clubs are a detriment to the home either speaks without evidence or generalizes from an exceptionally poor specimen. Doubtless, among the tens of thousands of club members, there may be here and there, one who neglects her home. In a long and somewhat extended experience, I have known but two.

Whatever develops a woman so that she is more of a woman enhances her value in the home. This is exactly what a club does. Take at random the calendars of a dozen clubs, and see the subjects considered, grave and gay, educational or entertaining, and it is evident that the minds of members have gone in lines where they would never have ventured but for the stimulus of the club program. Although much of this is superficial, a proportion of the club is set to thinking, and some are led to further knowledge, but all gain in general intelligence.

This happens especially in clubs which concentrate efforts on a single topic and follow it consecutively, so that it becomes study. The subject may be literature, or art, or history, or occasionally something deeper is chosen—economics, social conditions or current philanthropy. The result is a widening of intelligence, a deepening of sympathies and the stimulating effect of new ideas. Nothing brings more surely a sense of refreshment or even exhilaration. And to whom is this more grateful than to the mother of a family? The complexity of modern life makes hard demands on her, and whatever keeps her from becoming petty or stolid or discouraged is heaven-sent.

Nothing has developed club women so generously as their attempts at social service, in activities for town improvements, or for social betterment. And most nobly have the gentlemen co-operated in these efforts.

Many of the best clubs give attention to matters which bear directly on the home life, such as household economics in many of its varied ramifications, arts and crafts, household appointments and the training of children. I doubt if the club exists which has not taken up some phase of education, and many of them have discussed the development of hand and eye, as well as brains and morals. We shall never know how many boys and girls have had better educations on account of the ideas their mothers received at the club.

One of the best results from club experience has been improved conversational powers, not only in better subjects on which to talk, but a finer English and better expression. The households are not few where the evening meal after "mother's club" is anticipated with special pleasure, because she gives to her family the substance of the lecture or class work which she has just enjoyed. A gentleman once paid a crowning compliment to the woman's club by saying, "It makes a woman more interesting to her husband."
