Where There's a Will There's a Way.

There never was a truer saying than that old one that "Where there's a will there's a way." The history of all our great men, is the

story of struggle and perseverance the result of an unflinching purpose. There is nothing that can prevent a boy from succeeding if he wants to bad enough to pay the price.

A little colored boy down on a southern plantation would be the last person we would think of for an illustration of this proverb. This little black boy's father or mother could neither read or write but they were determined that their children should be educated. During the stormy reconstruction period they worked a white man's farm, he getting all the cotton and three loads of corn to their one, besides charging them from 15 to 100 per cent on money advanced. Often the whole family was without food for days, and the children fought with the dogs for pie crusts from the white folks' table. Yet the boys were sent to school, and when the white landlord wanted them to stay at home and pick cotton the black mother used to outgeneral him by slipping this particular boy off through the woods and swamps, with her hands on his back, shoving him along till he was well on the way, and then returning to the field to do as much herself as the landlord expected from her and the boy together. When the boy got a little older the mother worked another scheme. He and his brother were sent to school on alternate days. And each taught the other what he had learned during the day.

When this son of a resourceful mother found his way to Tuskegee and felt the inspiration of Booker T. Washington's personality he vowed that he would educate himself there or be buried in the school cemetery. At times it was doubtful which it should be, for extreme poverty and overwork almost killed him, but he lived to carry the Tuskegee light into darkest Mississippi. His name is William H. Holtzclaw, and he is principal of a successful normal and training school at Utica, Miss., where he and his wife, with eleven teachers and 400 students are following in the footsteps of their instructor.

Business success does not bring happiness. "Man cannot live by bread alone," by estates and dollars, if he could he would only be an animal. What the world wants to-day is men who will amass golden thoughts and golden deeds, and not mere golden dollars. Good men don't work for money, they work for character. Character is perpetual wealth, and by the side of him who has it the millionaire who has it not is a pauper. Plain living, high thinking and useful effort are real riches.

A New York woman recently refused to live in luxury on the money that her husband won on the race track. How many women sit down to tables bending and groaning with luxuries, while those who work for their husbands would be glad to get what their servants waste? Thousands of women sup on champagne and lobster, gorgeously arrayed, with homes in the country, by the seaside, in the mountains and in the city, how did they get these things—by accepting money that their husbands gouge and grind from the weaknesses, necessities and sins of humanity. Do these women ever think that spending money that is tainted makes them as guilty as the men who oppress and steal for them?
