cation have enough packages to ship to make up the difference such a law would make in his property? There is such a thing as justice in paying toll on those things that maintain our welfare. This toll is the profit we pay our local merchants on the goods we buy of them. It is not only right, but it is necessary to our welfare to do so. This margin of profit represents the prosperity of a community just as it represents the prosperity of the city when spent by mail. In either case it exists and must always exist, for upon it is built the whole structure of business. Shipping charges are invaluable as a partial guaranty of the proper placing of this toll.

Not that shipping charges as they exist are in themselves a praiseworthy thing. In fact Mr. Matthews has here touched upon the one laudable feature of the parcels post, to obtain which we must swallow the whole revolting mass. The government should be responsible for railroad shipments, instead of the express companies. But this can be effected without the adoption of the parcels post bill. It can done with a measure that does not include the other features at all, and is therefore no argument whatever in favor of the adoption of the parcels post. We need not hull shell and all to get the kernel.

In fact Mr. Matthews whole di-course is that of a man who has convinced himself by logic, wrongly based on the justness of this thing, with no regard to his real feeling in the matter. Himself a staunch supporter of home trade, he would remove the last barrier to its worst enemy.

Were every man of the same cast as Mr. Matthews, could every man make a "confession" like his, we need not fear a thousand parcels post measures, but unfortunately such is not the case. Home trade is what makes us prosperous, and home trade we must have if we are to so continue. Therefore we say the parcels post measure, for the boosting of which Postmaster General Meyer has constantly abused the government postage franking privilege, must be beaten.
