In neighboring cities, Wichita, Tulsa, Oklahoma City and Springfield, there is an epidemic of robberies and burglaries still going on, but since the sentences given in these cases, the word has gone out that Jasper County is a bad place for law violators to operate and these crimes have practically ceased in this county.

Out of the number of convictions 110 received jail sentences. There has been assessed in fines \$13,850, for the violation of the Prohibition Act and the amount of these fines collected is far in excess of the expense incurred by the county in the prosecution of the cases.
