MISSOURI STATE NEWS

Court of Honor Meeting.

The state convention of the Court of Honor of Missouri was held in Moberly with over 100 delegates in attendance. The address of welcome was made by City Attorney Ball and was responded to by E. V. Selleck of St. Louis. The election of delegates to the national convention, to be held at Indianapolis, resulted as follows: E. V. Selleck and W. R. Egelhoff, St. Louis; M. L. Barton, Moberly; P. J. Rieger, Kirksville; Kittle S. Arnold, Cameron; W. S. O'Bannon, Buffalo; Wm. Griffin, Edgar R. Parks, Springfield; M. M. Freeman, West Plains; Mary E. Donaldson, Gertrude Hillstrom, Kansas City; W. A. Mussetter, La Grange; W. M. Barnum, Louisiana; J. M. Moore, Shelby; Otto Moser, Bolivar; Julius Gerder of St. Louis was elected an alternate delegate. The following state officers were elected: State chancellor, W. A. Mussetter, La Grange; state recorder, Otto Mosher, Bolivar; state treasurer, W. M. Barnum, Louisiana.

William Jewell Filers Elect.

The Aero club of William Jewell elected officers. The club decorated the courthouse and college buildings with aero pennants and the chapel with posters from the Aero club of Pennsylvania University. The club of William Jewell has a gliding machine ordered, also working models of airships. The club has twelve members and is limited to fourteen. The requirements for membership are that the candidate shall have made one or more trips in a basket balloon. They will send delegates to the North American aeronautic meet, to be held in Philadelphia April 1 and 2. H. H. Williams, who has made several long distance flights in basket balloons, was elected chief engineer.

Exploding Engine Does Great Damage.

The boiler of Charles Meinershoffer's sand dredge exploded at Boonville doing a great deal of damage to the works of the plant. Nothing but kindling wood remains. The dredge sank immediately, where it was tied up for the night. Flues were thrown a distance of two blocks and buried deep in the ground, one penetrating a large sycamore tree to the depth of five inches. Stammerjohn, the forist, is at a considerable loss. There were over three hundred glasses broken in his greenhouses and many residences along the river were damaged by falling iron and timbers on roofs. A number of plate glass windows uptown were broken. No lives were lost. The estimated loss is \$7,000.

Now He'll Pay the Penalty.

Robert W. Davis, a negro, who killed Harry D. Evans, also a negro, in Kansas City November 13, 1908, will be hanged April 29 unless his sentence is commuted by the governor. The supreme court affirmed the judgment of the trial court. Evans was 17 years old. The theory was that the boy was killed for his watch and money. His body was found in a manhole. Davis is 22 years old. The court says there is no suggestion of insanity or mitigating circumstances.

Hanged Himself at 83.

The body of Allen Rush, long a resident of Cooper county, was found hanging to the limb of a tree near his home, seven miles south of Boonville, by his daughter-in-law, Mrs. Arthur Rush. Rush was 83 years old and very feeble. He owned the farm on which he lived.

Springfield Extends Limits.

The city limits of Springfield were extended at a special election by a majority of 56 votes. The fight was between the north and south side of town. The extension of the limits will increase the population of the city about 5,000.

To Block "Future" Tax.

The Kansas City and St. Louis brokers and commission men who have been contesting the act of the legislature of 1907 imposing a stamp tax of twenty-five cents on every deal in "futures," filed a motion with the clerk of the state supreme court in Jefferson City to transfer the case decided against them. The case was decided in Division 2 and with the concurrence of all the judges. In the motion filed it is contended that the law seeks to take property without due process of law, and, accordingly, is in conflict with the constitution. Division 2 held that no federal question was involved.

Quit Business for Farm Talk.

The seed, soil and dairy special from the agricultural college of the University of Missouri visited Unionville. Seven lecturers were aboard, headed by Dean Mumford of the agricultural college. Six lectures were delivered during a forty minute stop. A thousand people, headed by the Unionville band, met the train on its arrival. The business houses closed during the time the train was here.

To Fly at William Jewell.

The Aero club of the University of Pennsylvania has asked William Jewell to join in the Inter-Collegiate Aeronautic convention to be held in Philadelphia the first week in April. A club has been formed backed by Prof. John H. Davis of the science department of William Jewell. The club will have for its object the promoting of the science of aerial navigation. It will send two delegates to the convention in Philadelphia, one to learn the gliding machine and one to study the different makes of airships.


