STUFFING A POLICEMAN.
How the Man from Indiana Came to Hunt for His Niece,

And While Searching for Her Got Other Parties Into Trouble.

After Which he Skipped the City, and Now Jeffers Mourns Muchly.
He came in on the express from St. Louis last Wednesday afternoon and took quarters at Bonner's Main street restaurant, where he gave his name as William Wilson, and claimed Indianapolis as his place of residence. The next morning he met Officer Tom Jeffers on the street, and calling him to one side, exhibited a photograph of a young lady of about seventeen years, who he represented as his niece who had eloped with a man from Indianapolis named McDonald. He had traced the couple to St. Louis, where he learned they had purchased tickets for Sedalia and had left for this city on the 10th inst. Wilson was a good talker and he had no difficulty in convincing Jeffers of the truthfulness of his story, and the officer promised to do all in his power to ascertain the whereabouts of the missing girl, whose name was represented to be

ELLA WILSON.
Wilson also represented himself as a detective, and as such asked permission to search the various houses of all shape for his niece, but Jeffers referred him to the mayor for such privilege.

On the arrival of every train Wilson was at the depot, eagerly scanning the faces of all the females, and during the days and nights he made inquiries at numerous places throughout the city, but up to Saturday night no trace of the lost one could be had—so he said. But now comes the part that proves conclusively that Wilson was a fraud.
At half-past 3 o'clock Sunday morning, a negro woman named Mrs. Butler, who lives on St. Louis street, called at the residence of Officer Jeffers and informed him that a party of men were at her house, and had been raising a terrible disturbance. Jeffers immediately dressed and hastened to the scene, where he found five men, one of whom had beaten down the door, while the entire fire had conducted themselves disgracefully. Two of them took to their heels and made their escape before he was identified. The remaining three were found to be the man about whom referred to, Wilson, and Charlie Cook, of Holden, and Al. Black, who lives six miles northwest of Sedalia. Jeffers took Cook and Black into custody, and told Wilson he had

which advice he was not slow in heeding. Jeffers brought his two prisoners down as far as Second and Lamine streets, where both broke away and ran, Cook going south and Black west on Second. Jeffers says he was satisfied Black was the man who had battered down the door, so took after him and allowed Cook to escape. He pursued him as far as the calaboose, the fleeing man being some thirty yards in advance. At the calaboose corner Officers Carney and Shanewerk came upon the scene, and the three pursued Black, calling upon him repeatedly to stop. He refused, when Jeffers

and Carney and Shanewerk several each, but still there was no stop for Black.
At Kentucky street he turned north, and ran to Main, where he was found concealed in the Pearl river sewer, and was brought out by Officer Schanewerk, who crawled in after him. He was taken to the calaboose, where he spent the Sabbath and was visited by his father yesterday afternoon.

This morning he was taken before Recorder Frank to answer the charge of intoxication and disturbing the peace, when he

FLEADED GUILTY
to both and was fined \$15, which he paid into the city's treasury. Only two witnesses, both colored women, were examined, and they said that Black was the man who kicked in the door, and had also threatened Mrs. Butler with a revolver.
In conversation with a Bazon reporter, Black gave his story as follows: He and Cook came in from the west Saturday night at 11 o'clock, and both were pretty drunk. At the depot they met the middle detective, Wilson, who represented himself as a policeman. They kept company together for two or three hours, drinking in the meantime, and at last Wilson proposed that they visit a

offering to conduct them to one. They agreed, and Wilson, when admission was refused, kicked in the front and back doors. He supposed Wilson was an officer and had a right to do what he did. He denied that he had a revolver, and seemed sorry for his part of the disturbance.

The most guilty one of the party was undoubtedly Wilson, who, after the arrest of the other two, made himself scarce and has not been seen since. A portion of Black's story is probably correct, and if Wilson is found, he should receive the full penalty of the law.
It does seem a little strange, though, that Jeffers allowed himself to be imposed upon as he was, and in future he will probably fight shy of those who court his favor and fill him with taffy.
The general impression is that Wilson is a crook who was trying to work the town. Michael Smith says if he had run across the fellow Saturday night he would have had him on the rock pile as a vagrant.

WIFE OR NO WIFE.
A Prominent Attorney Who Denies That He is a Husband,

While the Woman Insists That He is, and is the Father of Her Children.

A prominent attorney of Carthage, named R. F. Buler, who is known by several people of Sedalia, has evidently got his foot in it, and that pretty deep, too, for the sworn testimony of a woman claiming to be his wife is to be credited, and so far her evidence and the peculiar circumstances surrounding the case are in her favor by a large majority. The woman who claims to be his legal wife is Mary F. the daughter of Peter Myers, who is not only well known in Carthage as at one time a prominent banker, but also throughout the county.

What makes the matter of more interest and peculiar is that Buler repudiates her and pronounces her claims to having been married to him a fraud. Last summer the defendant was married to a prominent Carthage county lady.
The lady's statements are plain and straight forward and show, if she tells the truth, that a black and damnable wrong has been done her, and one that would bring the blush of shame to the face of any man, and the just indignation of the people upon his head. It is for the courts to decide whether they were married or not, but we give the woman's statement as she gives it, believing that it will be of interest:

On the 24th of April, 1876, Mr. Buler and Miss Myers took a long drive to Baxter Springs, he to attend to some business and she to visit a cousin. They had been engaged to be married, but no date set. Somewhere on the road between Spring River and Shool Creek, in Kansas, Mr. Buler drove up to a log house, and stopping, informed her that in case she consented, a man lived there who would marry them. To this she acquiesced, and they were then and there married, for which Mr. Buler paid the man who performed the ceremony a ten dollar bill.

From there they went to Baxter and took rooms at a hotel, he, as she claims, treating her in every respect as his legally married wife and who she honestly believed she was. From there they went to the Gulf house, Ft. Scott, Kas., where the same relationship existed between them. From there Mr. Buler sent her to Canada, paying her expenses. He afterwards wrote for her return and met her as "a man would his wife." At his request the marriage was kept a secret, but in time people began to gossip. Buler then left Carthage and shortly afterward a notice appeared in the St. Louis R-P bulletin announcing the marriage of R. F. Buler and Miss Mary F. Myers, some two years previous.

This was a half way surprise to the people of Carthage and vicinity; but it had the effect of setting the gossip at root. In the meantime the lady gave birth to two children, which everybody did not recognize as Buler's. Later Buler denied the marriage in toto, claiming that no such ceremony had ever been performed.

Her testimony shows that such a ceremony had been performed, but whether by a person legally authorized or not she does not know; but if she has been duped there will be a speedy day of reckoning over this. She describes the place at which they were married very minutely, and the Joplin papers think it will soon be identified.

Mrs. Buler gave her supposed husband anything but a favorable character for manliness. In her testimony she says: "I remember meeting Mr. Buler last fall (this was after he had shaken her); he said that he desired to talk to me awhile. I laid my hand upon my arm and he took his hat and hit me on the cheek, and as he pushed by I told him he would get himself into trouble if he did not watch. I walked along behind him, when he started and ran from me." She says that she saw him from the man who will "lay his hand on woman save in kindness" will apply in this case.

If the poor girl has been duped into a mock marriage and her ruin thus wrought, there is no punishment severe enough for the man who would be guilty of such a dastardly deed. If, on the other hand, she is a blackmailing scheme on her part, she is evidently the cleverest woman in that line the Bazon has heard of, and it has heard many.

The Smithton Rioters.
In Squire Clark's court, to-day, Wm. Lucie, one of the parties implicated in the Smithton riot something over three weeks ago, pleaded guilty, and was fined \$15 and costs, making a total of \$35.33.
Frank Waters, another of the party, forfeited his bond of \$25 by not appearing for trial. He was the least guilty of any of the gang, and his fine would probably not have reached that figure.

A Miner Killed.
A well known Short Creek miner named Charley Pollard, aged about twenty-four years, was killed while at work in the mines at that place about noon Saturday. He was at the bottom of the shaft, which is sixty feet deep, and had just sent up a tub of dirt, but before the tub reached the top it became detached from the rope and fell back, striking him on the head and shoulder. He was taken out as quickly as possible and physicians sent for, who pronounced his skull badly fractured and that he had sustained other serious injuries. Although everything was done for him that medical skill could suggest, he lived only about two hours after the accident—Joplin News.

Miss Mary Carter, daughter of W. F. Carter, ex-county collector, died this morning, which makes a total of five deaths from the disease.
