## RESOLUTION NO. 4

Be it resolved by the Council of the City of Monett, Missouri, as follows:

**FIRST:**—Whereas there are a great number of Cess Pools in the city that are now being used which are detrimental to the Public Health of the city, and whereas on the 19th day of November 1907 the City Council of Monett by Ordinance No. 275 declared it necessary for sanitary purposes that all property in the Sewer Districts to be connected with the District Sewers, and whereas it is further provided in said ordinance that all who shall fail to begin to make connections within five days after written notice has been served on him or her by the City Marshal shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined not exceeding \$100.00 for failure to so connect with said District Sewers. Therefore the Marshal is hereby instructed to notify any and all persons owning improved real estate abutting upon or adjoining an alley in which any District Sewer is located or established, to at once connect up with said District Sewers and discontinue the use of all Cess Pools and make a report to the City Council upon whom he has served such notices, and the names of all who fail to begin the work of connecting with the sewers of the city within five days after said notices are served.

**SECOND:**—The City Clerk shall at once deliver a copy of this resolution to the City Marshal. A true copy of original adopted by the council April 25, 1914.
