HOW TO SEE HUGE SPOT NOW APPEARING ON SUN

A photograph of the sun taken at the naval observatory at Washington on March 29, just developed, discloses a spot about 100,000 miles in length on the northwestern limb of the orb. As the sun revolved this disturbed area came into view, and probably will be visible, the officials of the observatory say, up to about April 10. The officials give instructions for observing the spot as follows:

"By holding a piece of smoked glass in front of one of the object glasses of an ordinary opera glass, and looking through this side only, using one eye, the spot may be plainly seen. Caution should be used not to get the full glare of the sun in the eye, and the side of the glasses not in use turned away from instead of toward the other eye, so as to avoid the possibility of the sun's rays striking that eye through the glass."

NOTICE TO PROPERTY OWNERS

Notice is hereby given to all persons in the city owning improved property that the ordinances of the city passed and approved on November 19th, 1907, requires you to connect your property with the city sewers and a failure to do so, subjects you to a fine of not more than one hundred dollars.

As a sanitary measure and for the purpose of preventing disease and pestilence and for the general good and welfare of all the inhabitants and the health of the people, the City Council deems it essential and necessary that every one having city water, discontinue the use of cess-pools and closets and connect their property with the city sewers at once.

This notice is given for the purpose of warning all and everyone that the ordinance is going to be put into force and effect strictly regardless of whom it may be, so that we may be enabled to have good and wholesome sanitary conditions in the city during the coming hot summer weather.

Any failure to comply with this notice will be prosecuted by the city authorities. I therefore deem it proper to give all persons fair warning so as to save you costs and the expense of litigation in the courts. I hope that all will get busy and connect up with the city sewers at once.
