SCHOOL BOARD URGES MORE SENSIBLE DRESS

Carthage, Mo., April 17.—Resolutions urging the girls of the Carthage high school, especially the girls of the senior class, to use more simplicity in their dress and to wear less expensive clothing, have been adopted by the board of education and by the high school faculty. The adoption of these resolutions was the first step in a campaign for more sensible and less expensive dress among the pupils of the high school.

The idea of starting such a campaign originated among members of the faculty because of preparations being made by some of the members of the senior class for commencement exercises. The money required to pay the expenses of a girl during the senior year, incurred through the expense of commencement dresses and extravagant frocks for graduation, has been the cause for the failure of many to finish the high school course in past years. An effort to eliminate this cause and to bring about a simpler and more sensible form of dress is the aim of the school board and the faculty.






