CITIZENS FAVORABLE TO PUBLIC PARK PROPOSITION

An editorial in a recent edition of The Times, advocating the purchase of a fourteen-acre tract of woodland for use as a public park, is favorably received by many of our citizens. The tract is a portion of the old Marshall land on Marshall Hill and lies within the city limits.

Monett people are obliged to depend on neighboring towns for picnic grounds and they are anxious to secure a public park of their own. The Marshall tract can be purchased at a reasonable figure and with the expenditure of a comparatively small sum, it can be fitted up for an amusement park, which will be a benefit to the town and surrounding country.

About half the tract is in woodland and the remainder has been cleared. There is room for a ball park, tennis court, croquet ground, basket ball and other sports. There could also be a portion set aside for the convenience of the Ozark Playgrounds tourists.

The general opinion is that the project should be financed by a bond issue, as in this way everyone would help pay for it and the small amount assessed from each property owner would not be noticed. The city is constantly paying off old bonds and city taxes are lower now than they have been for some time, so the small additional tax would not be a burden to anyone.

The question will probably be discussed by the members of the Commercial club in a meeting to be held in a short time.
