Compounding Felony. Stealing a loaf of bread is called "theft," and is severely punished. The fact that a man's family is hungry, or that he himself may be starving is al- lowed to cut no figure in a court, or in the strict and prompt administration of law. But stealing from a great state, like South Dakota, when the amount is \$100,000, is called a "defalcation." The man who commits the crime consults with his bondsmen, and they deliberately advise him to steal another \$100,000 and run away. He follows their advice. The bondsmen then propose a compromise. Up to this date their little game has not worked out as they expected. But there are rumors about that Taylor is to return, receive a nominal punishment, and the bondsmen go to court free. Men who will condone crime in this way, whether they be officials or not, are themselves thieves, and should share the punishment of the original thief. We strongly deprecate even the use of the softer or big-ou- word "defalcation." Taylor is in no sense other than a deliberate thief, and those who attempt to shield him and his abettors from the due consequences of their crime become participes criminis, and public sentiment should class them all together as felons.

The director of the U. S. mint has completed his estimate of the world's production of gold and silver during the year 1894. It is placed at \$1,815,000,000 as against \$1,828,000,000 in 1893, an increase of \$22,674,000 silver \$241,381,000 as against \$249,132,955 in 1893, an increase of \$5,248,655. This is the largest production of both metals in the history of the world. In 1870 the production of gold was \$106,850,000, and of silver \$51,575,000. This it will be seen that since 1870 the production of gold has increased about 80 per cent, while the production of silver has increased over 400 per cent. In 1892 the production of silver was only \$60,500,000 against \$241,381,000 now. The production of gold in 1890 was \$119,250,000 against \$181,500,000 now. Thus it will be seen that since 1890 the production of gold has increased about 50 per cent, while the production of silver has increased over 500 per cent. These figures would seem to suggest that there may be some mistake about the notion that either gold or silver is becoming scarcer.

Still Another Scheme.

Ex-Gov. Boies, of Iowa, will most probably be the Democratic gubernatorial candidate again. He has also just written another letter upon the silver question, in which he not only reiterates his advocacy of the free coinage of silver by the United States, without any co-operation with foreign nations, but advocates the plan for this government to issue silver certificates to the value of all silver product of the country, these certificates to be made to take the place of all other forms of paper money, as far as possible. He holds that the world increases the value of bullion silver to such an extent as would make it equal with gold. As it is now, the national bank notes to the amount of \$195,000,000, the United States treasury notes amounting \$310,000,000 and the silver certificates to the extent of \$230,236,236, in circulation among the people and in the banks of the country, are at par with gold. To issue silver certificates in addition, equal in amount to the silver product of the United States, would cause the \$525,236,236 paper currency, now in circulation, and gold values to part company and place our currency solely on a silver basis, and no one can even guess what premium gold would go to as the result.
