



The report was started on Thursday that the Leader would be out for McKinley this week and that we had gotten a check for \$100 from Mark Hanna and within an hour and check went to the magnificent sum of \$200. The official report of the director of the mint shows that during the month of August there were coined \$2,650,000 silver dollars. Could the free coinage advocates ask more? That is almost the full capacity of the mints, and if the Bryanite and friends of the silver mine owners were in charge of the government they could do but little more for the intended use of silver. And yet these "stumpers" go following over the country that nothing is being done for silver.

From 1878 and subsequently, in 1880, the Republican party gave to the people more silver dollars than were ever coined--nearly fifty times as many silver dollars as were coined prior to that time. During the three year that Secretary Carlisle has had charge of the treasury \$6,000,000 full legal tender silver dollars have been coined, and \$8,000,000 coined during the eighty years of free coinage.

By invitation or challenge of the manager of the Free Silver club of the McKinley district, Mr. Murphy was secured to engage their champion in joint debate, on last Friday evening, October 2d, and at the appointed time he appeared cordially on hand. A friendly and peaceable discussion of the issues of the day was had, and closed to by an attentive and respectful audience, each speaker seeming to handle his subject to the satisfaction of his followers. Altogether, it was an orderly meeting of a kind seldom seen in this city, and could be profitably patterned after by some of Holt county's over-enthusiastic political featherweights in their conduct at public meetings.
