In Foreign Lands.

Miss Lois Richards, in her letter of June 30th, announces her departure from Paris, and her arrival at Versailles, fascinated beyond description of the apartments of the Grand Palace of the old kings of France.

"We were on the train for 12 consecutive hours and reached Lucerne dirty and tired. We had a splendid dinner; the best I have had since Christmas times, and devoted fully an hour to the meal. Our hotel at Lucerne was a very fine one. Swiss, you know; our beds well—feather beds on top as well as below.

"From here we took a "run out" for sight seeing as one would do from Denver—we went to Lugano, Italy, the riding being by train through the picturesque and only Alps; through the St. Gotthard tunnel—the longest I believe in the world, 9 1/2 miles.

"The snow capped mountains were so plain to view, which was greatly marred by the coming up of a heavy rain storm, and then followed by a snow storm. Then we took a steamer on Lakes Lugano and Como, and then on a little "dinky train" through, over and around the mountains. Words fail me to express the beauties of the wonderful waterfalls; snow caps; rivers and lakes—here you see

all the beauties and wonders of nature's handiwork.

"In sunny Italy—yet it rains—Only one day since we reached the continent has it been clear. So funeral like here as compared with Paris. Paris is simply deafening with its taxies, bells and thousands of gay things—Paris is the place if one wants to keep on the go, but is no place for one who wishes to rest. The only familiar thing that has come to our vision since we left was Heinz 57, which we saw in Bologne, and even that seemed like an old friend.

"We are located in the Hotel Belle Vue, and I have a delightful view of the lake, from a balcony on to which I can step from my room, the waters of the lake not being over 50 feet away. Over on the opposite side rises the beautiful mountains, with little villas scattered here and there around the base, and only a few minutes ago a big rainbow arched over the whole view.

"We reached Cadenabbia, in due time from whence I write you. We are going, going, going—all the time from early morn till midnight. The rear of the hotel opens out on the mountain side, and it has been converted into a great garden. From here we go to Milan and thence to
