TYPHOID COULD BE STOPPED.
Fifth, Flies and Bad Water to Blame for Disease's Prevalence, Says Expert.
The great progress made in the last five years in combating typhoid fever shows that we could entirely eradicate it from the United States was one of the opinions ventured by Dr. Allen W. Freeman, epidemiologist in the United States Public Health Service, in his lecture on "Typhoid Fever," at the University of Missouri, at Columbia, recently. Dr. Freeman placed the blame for typhoid fever on bad water and the exposure of filth to flies.
