FOUR REPUBLICAN SUPREME JUSTICES AND ONLY THREE DEMOCRATS

Honest Democrats May Spoil Plans of the Practical Politicians

Special Correspondence.

Jefferson City, Mo., December 26.—The approaching session of the Forty Sixth General Assembly makes Jefferson City the storm centre of Missouri politics. The advance guard has arrived and gone into camp. The practical politicians will be here before the session opens on Wednesday of this week. They are the fellows who pull the wires and set off the fire crackers. They are not members of the Legislature but they sing the songs that stir the real law makers. They will be here not merely to look on but to direct the organization of the law making bodies and to set in motion the Democratic partisan forces with which they hope to dominate everything in the legislature. That these practical Democratic politicians have some desperate schemes in hand, no one about the capital doubts, but there is well founded doubt about their success. Among the Democratic senators and members there are many men who will not be like party in the hands of the practical politicians. They have views and purposes of their own. They are honest and conscientious, however partisan they may be. They may come here believing that Democratic candidates for state offices were not

honestly defeated, because they have not come in contact with men or publications from which to learn how the practical Democratic politicians have fled, but here they will learn the truth—and they will not be easily led by men who would have them believe a lie. A dozen of such men can block the scheme of Shannon and his like to cast out enough honestly elected Republicans to secure a Democratic majority of two-thirds in each house, and thus over ride Governor Hadley and use the legislature for partisan purposes. Such a course on the part of the Democrats in the legislature will damn their party. While the hot heads have up to this time, been cherishing such a scheme, the honest and conservative Democrats who will be here in a few days are yet to be reckoned with and may revolt. Undoubtedly some of them will revolt and the caucus lash will not frighten them.
