Combination with Coal-tar Colors.

Investigations appear to show that the unhealthfulness of wearing apparel that has any combination with coal-tar colors, is due to the fact that the agents employed in the preparation of aniline colors are, in many instances, deleterious, among these being the compounds of arsenic, zinc, tin, antimony, lead, together with hydrochloric and picric acids.

Overreaching.

Many horses have the very unpleasant habit of striking the toes of the hind shoes against those on the fore feet. Most horsemen will agree that it is a fault attaching to some of the best, as well as the worst of horses.

Brief Hints.

Get all your harvest tools ready without delay, don't wait till you want to use them. Run the cultivator through your corn and potatoes once a week—it will pay.

Early Garden Vegetables.

The prices that early vegetables command in country villages and particularly in larger towns are often double those obtained at wholesale in large cities, as such markets often become glutted with vegetables and small fruits which have to be sold very low.

Fritters.

Two eggs; one pint buttermilk; one teaspoon saleratus, three-fourths teaspoon salt; flour enough to make a stiff batter. Fry in hot lard, putting in a spoonful at a time.

Feather Cake.

One egg well-beaten; two tablespoons butter; one cup sugar; one-half cup sweet milk; two teaspoons baking powder in two cups of flour; flavor with lemon. This is cheap and while fresh very good.


