In accordance with instructions from the department of justice, United States District Attorney E. A. Fiske, to day filed suit against Romulo Martinez as principal, and against C. H. The following resolutions were adopted by the board of county commissioners, in session this week:

Whereas, The city government of the city of Santa Fe, has been duly organized on the 13th day of July, 1891, therefore be it

Resolved by the board of county commissioners of the county of Santa Fe that the county of Santa Fe declines to provide water or light facilities for the section contained within the incorporated limits of Santa Fe.

Resolved, That the county of Santa Fe hereby and from this date dispense with the services of any and all policemen heretofore employed by said county for said town, now the city of Santa Fe, and that the pay for any and all such policemen shall and will cease from and after this date, July 14, 1891.

Resolved, That as the position of coroner of this county is simply a sinecure, the duties of that officer as chief of police of the county of Santa Fe being no longer required to be performed, the city government being in full possession of the city of Santa Fe and fully able to protect the peace of the city, hence the salary of said coroner is from and after this date reduced to \$20 per month, which amount will be hereafter paid to said officer upon accounts duly presented to the board and properly sworn to.

Resolved, That hereafter no account for salary, for services or for supplies will be allowed by this board except upon properly prepared and sworn vouchers and bills as required by law.

Pursuant to the provisions of an act of the 29th Legislative Assembly of New Mexico, entitled "An Act to provide for the incorporation of towns and villages in the Territory of New Mexico and for other purposes," approved February 14th, A. D. 1891.—All the requirements of said act having been fully complied with by the majority of the qualified voters resident of the territory embraced in the incorporated town of Cerrillos, which is more particularly described as follows, to wit:

Being all of Sections number Seventeen (17), Eighteen (18), Nineteen (19) and Twenty (20), Township Fourteen (14), North of Range Eight (8), East of the New Mexico Principal Meridian, in said county of Santa Fe.

The undersigned, the Board of County Commissioners for Santa Fe County aforesaid, do hereby call and proclaim an election within said Town of Cerrillos to be held on

TUESDAY, August 18, A. D. 1891, at the public school house in said town of Cerrillos, in the County and Territory aforesaid, between the hours of Eight o'clock A. M., and Six o'clock P. M., on said day. And it is further ordered and proclaimed, that the officers to be voted for at said election shall be as follows, viz: A Town Marshal; a Board of Trustees, to be composed of five members—which shall be known as the Board of Town Trustees; and pursuant to said act, Richard Green, Charles W. Uptegrove and Adam E. Laudenslager, are hereby appointed judges of said election, and Edward Baker and Harry Scranton, clerks of said election.
