Notice to Tax-Payers.

The method of getting the inventories this year has been somewhat different than that employed in former years and will result, we hope, in raising the grand list of the city and the listing of all taxable polls. The Assessors wish to thank the tax-payers for the way they have generally responded to the call for inventories and trust that no one has suffered any serious inconvenience by reporting at the assessing office rather than having the Assessors hunt them down. Only a few days remain in which to get in the lists of inventories, and in order that the Assessors may have time to prepare the abstracts required by law, all inventories must be in this week.
The Assessors now have on file in the office the names of nearly all taxable persons, and have the right to set all taxable polls and real estate in the list even if inventories are not filed or neglected, but for the purpose of accuracy in names and residences it is desirable that every taxable person sign an inventory.
This list will be the basis of making up the check list for city and state elections, and the Assessors wish it to be as accurate as possible, and for that reason, except veterans, should see to it that their names are entered. All inventories must be handed in this week.

WARNING.

Whereas, at a meeting of the Board of Aldermen held April 21st, A. D. 1903, a resolution was adopted directing the Mayor to call a special city meeting for the purpose of electing a Moderator, the legal voters of the City of Barre, in the County of Washington and State of Vermont, are hereby notified and warned to meet in the City Hall, in said City, on Wednesday, the 6th day of May, A. D. 1903, at 7:30 o'clock P. M., to act on the following articles, viz:

- First—To elect a Moderator to preside at said meeting.
- Second—To see if the City will vote to authorize the City Council to pledge the credit of the City, by issuing a note or notes, to an amount not to exceed the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to raise money to pay the running expenses of the City in anticipation of taxes.
- Third—To see if the City will vote to issue its note or bonds for the purpose of paying for the new school-house which the City at its last meeting authorized the school Commissioners to erect, and if so, to determine what amount of bonds or notes, or both, shall be issued and the rate per cent of interest, and at what time and place they shall be payable, and whether the same shall be registered or have interest coupons annexed.
- Fourth—To see if the City will vote to authorize the Mayor to call a special city meeting for the purpose of electing a Moderator, to be held on the 6th day of May, A. D. 1903.




RESIDENCE OF J. W. GORDON, RICHARDSON STREET.
