

held April 7th, A. D. 1903, a resolution was
adopted directing the City Engineer to call a special
city meeting for the purpose of calling a special
election, the legal voters of the City of
Barre, in the County of Washington, in the State
of Vermont, are hereby notified and warned to
meet in the City Hall, in said City, on Wednesday,
the 11th day of May, A. D. 1903, at 7.30
o'clock P. M., to act on the following articles, to-wit:
First—To elect a Moderator to preside at said
meeting.
Second—To see if the City will vote to authorize
the City Council to pledge the credit of the
City, by issuing a note or notes, to an amount
not in all to exceed the sum of twenty-five
thousand dollars (\$25,000) to raise money to pay
the running expenses of the City in anticipation
of taxes.
Third—To see if the City will vote to issue its
note or bonds for the purpose of paying for the
new school-house which the City at its last
meeting authorized the School Commissioners to
erect, and if it so votes, to determine what
amount of bonds or notes, or both, shall be
issued and the rate per cent of interest, and at
what time and place they shall be payable, and
whether the same shall be registered or have
interest coupons annexed.
Fourth—To do any other proper business.
