## The Saengerfest at Baltimore.

Baltimore, June 15.—Baltimore is in gala attire for the triennial saengerfest of the Northeastern saengerbund. Business houses in all parts of the city are lavishly decorated with flags, banners and streamers. The city council having appropriated \$25,000 for the purpose, the municipal buildings and the streets in the central part of the city have been profusely hung with strings of electric lights and electric domes, and illuminated courts of honor have been constructed. Thousands of visitors have already arrived, including the officials of many singing societies that are to take part in the festival.
