### CAGED WITH BEASTS.

Kidnaped and Trained for "Wild Boy" in Circus. East St. Louis, June 18.—Locked up in cages with monkeys and other animals, his face and hands discolored to disguise him and his clothing taken away to make him as near an animal as possible, was the experience of John Layton, a six-year-old boy, according to his story, just told the police. He was being trained to be a "wild boy" with a circus, and for a week after he was kidnaped from his parents he underwent tortures that have driven him almost insane. The face and hands of the boy are stained and scratched, and scars on his body bear evidence that the story of his treatment is true. Sylvester Baker, a negro at the show, is under arrest and has been taken to Belleville to prevent a possible lynching.
