Five Days on the Rocks.

St. John's, N. F., June 19.—After being five days on the rocks at Cod Roy the Allen line steamer Norwegian, Captain White, from Montreal for Glasgow with a general cargo and cattle, which went ashore at Cod Roy on Saturday morning, was floated off and towed round Cape Ray. She now lies moored at Port aux Basques, 300 miles from St. John's, and will probably be brought to this port and docked. The vessel is now under her own steam. She sustained only slight damage.

Ames & Co., the banking and brokerage firm whose suspension was forced on June 2 by a decline in the stock market, will pay every dollar of their indebtedness within eighteen months, with interest at 6 per cent. A statement has been issued on the position of the firm upon the basis of a trial balance of June 15.
