## Pittsburg Machinists May Strike.

Pittsburg, July 10.—Five thousand machinists of Pittsburg may be thrown out of employment following action to be taken at a mass meeting of local machinists. The men now have the sanction of their national officers to strike and will take a secret ballot in a meeting to be held at the old city hall. The vote will be whether they will accept an offer by the manufacturers of a 7 1/2 per cent increase or remain solid for their demand of a 20 per cent increase.

Oyster Bay, N. Y., July 10.—Former Governor Winthrop Murray Crane of Massachusetts, who was an overnight guest of President Roosevelt at Sagamore Hill, has left for home. His conference with the president was about some pending governmental matter on which the president desired his counsel and about the national campaign of next year, in the management of which former Governor Crane will play a conspicuous part.
