Barre Vermont Railroad.

Trains leaving Barre for White River Junction, Boston, New York and all intervening points at 8:30 a. m., 12 m. and 12:01 a. m. Local train for White River Junction and Windsor and intermediate stations leaves at 6:00 p. m.

Trains leave Barre for Burlington, St. Albans, Houses Point and Ogdenburg at 8:00 a. m. and 8:06, 8:30 and 10:01 a. m. Trains connect at Essex for points on Rutland road and the 5:30 connects with New York train for Montreal and points west leaves Barre at 8:05, 8:30 and 12 m.

For Williamstown leave Barre 1:30 and 4:30 p. m. Leave Williamstown at 7:30 a. m. and 2:30 p. m.

Montpelier & Wells River Railroad, Commencing June 22, 1903.


