CRAB FEAST.

More Than 150,000 Will Be Prepared For an Elks' Convention.

Plans are now complete for the great crab feast that will be one of the unique features of the entertainment of the 15,000 to 20,000 Elks at the national convention of their order in Baltimore the coming summer, says the New York Times. The feast will be held at Love point, on the Chesapeake bay, July 23. The Chesapeake crab will be served stewed, deysed, steamed, fried, in sandwiches, in soup and in salad. More than 150,000 crabs will be prepared.

The scene is to be picturesque in the extreme. The committee will engage 200 negro "mammys" with bandannas and aprons, to prepare the crabs, and they will be strung along the shore with tripods for the preparation of soup and other forms of cooked crab. Each "mammy" will be assisted by two little black pookanmies, and the scene will be typical of the sunny south. The committee has ordered 100 tripods of a capacity of twenty gallons each for the preparation of soup, and this shows on what a gigantic scale the affair is being planned. A prize will be given to the cook making the best soup.

In the kitchen of the new Casino at the Point will be women preparing crab salad and cooking the crabs in other ways.
